THE SELECTMEN'S COLUMN

There have been many changes since last month. Many for the good, depending on who you ask. One is the hiring of our new Town Administrator, William Caldwell from Athol who started on January 28th, 2019. Welcome to Becket, Mr. Caldwell! Many thanks and best wishes to our interim TA, Robert Markel, who helped in the transition. In other news, the townsfolk gathered for a Special Town Meeting and voted not to fund a UV-filtration system for the Route 20 Spring on the border of Becket and Chester. This was a contentious issue and we enjoyed a vigorous open debate and exchange of ideas with our Moderator Ethan Klepetar keeping us all on task. Thanks to Ethan K. and George Roberts, Town Clerk for a smoothly run Special Town Meeting. Other articles voted on and approved at the STM were a transfer of funds to help the Police Department keep up to date with their in-car and portable radio equipment, a transfer of funds to update the wireless router in Town Hall, two computers, and a change to the Solar by-laws to keep us in harmony with the Green Communities Act. This last item will allow the Town to apply for more grants and hopefully change over the old HVAC system in Town Hall to a newer and more energy-efficient model.

The Selectmen, Town Administrator and the Finance Committee are working on their 2018 annual reports and a budget for the next fiscal year. Our Broadband Ad Hoc Group had four informational sessions which were well-attended. Progress on the town-owned network is moving along nicely. BROADBAND

The Becket Broadband Ad Hoc Group recommended, and the Board of Selectmen accepted the recommendation that the broadband network in Becket will be Town-owned. Over the course of the public meetings several questions were asked regarding pricing, the Town-owned system and many other facets relating to this project. Green Communities Grant Projects Update

As many of you may know, Becket is exceeding targets in energy conservation. Down more than 30% since the inception of the grant, we have made vast improvements to nearly all town-owned facilities. In this most recent round, we have made upgrades at the Highway Garage on Lyman Street and Fire State #2 on Jacob's Ladder Road.

As part of the project, propane heaters, doors, windows and lights were replaced at the Highway Garage. The heaters, which are 93% efficient, coupled with the other projects, will bring significant savings to the Town. At Fire Station #2, windows were replaced for energy efficiency.

In addition to the most recent projects others were completed since the grant became available including work at the Town Hall and Fire Station #1.

At the Town Hall, we are exploring options for a small solar field to the southeast in the adjacent field to help offset energy costs for the building. As part of that project we hope to change over the heating/air conditioning system to either a propane system, or air-sourced heat pumps.

The Town has contracted with Bowman Engineering to advise on the best options moving forward. This work to the Town Hall HVAC system will hopefully be paid for in-part or in whole by the next round of the Competitive Green Communities Grant.

The work to reduce energy consumption and emissions has been supported by the Energy Committee, the Finance Committee and the Board of Selectmen. As the new Town Administrator, I hope to work alongside these groups to continue the efforts of reducing energy consumption and carbon emissions.

Community Reminders

Unregistered Vehicles

There have been several complaints regarding unregistered vehicles in the Town of Becket. Administration, Police and the Building Inspector have been working to address this issue. Below is the Town By-Law regarding unregistered vehicles, but in summary—no more than 1 unregistered vehicle is allowed.

ARTICLE 17--TOWN BETTERMENT BY-LAWS:

SECTION 8. The keeping of more than one unregistered automobile or truck assembled or disassembled, except by a person licensed under MGL Chapter 140, Section 59, on any premises shall not be permitted unless said automobiles or trucks are stored within an enclosed building. A permit to keep more than one unregistered automobile or truck on any premises not within an enclosed building may be granted by the Board of Selectmen, if it finds that such keeping is (1) in harmony with the general intent of this bylaw; (2) will not adversely affect the neighborhood; and (3) will not be a nuisance. All such permits granted shall limit the number of unregistered automobile and trucks to be kept on the premises by the permit holder, shall not run with land and shall be limited to a reasonable length of time. This article shall not apply to motor vehicles which are designed and used for farming. Who ever violates any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to a penalty of five (\$5.00) dollars per day for each day of violation commencing ten (10) days following receipt of written notice from the Board of Selectmen. (Adopted 5/11/85)

Route 20 Spring Update

The Town is working in conjunction with Town Counsel and the Mass DEP to figure out a course of action regarding the closure of the spring. We will bring forward more information regarding this when more is available in terms of a timeline, how this closure will be executed and any other next steps.
