We are waiting for the utility providers to complete their portion of the Make Ready process so that adjustments can be made and construction can begin. We hope this happens in a timely fashion. Finally, I want to again thank the Broadband Ad Hoc Group for their tireless efforts to bring such a needed project to the Town.

The Board of Selectmen will weigh some important decisions about drop policies and the way we choose to pay back the debt incurred by the municipal fiber loans. We welcome you to the bi-weekly Selectmen's meetings for your voice to be heard on these and other issues. The public input section of the agenda has been moved earlier on the agenda so that we may encourage our residents and second-home owners to share their ideas.

# Broadband update – February 2020

Thanks to all the residents who responded to the Broadband survey. The information will be very helpful.

The informational sessions which were scheduled for February will be rescheduled.

The Town has decided that it will join WiredWest. WiredWest will reduce Becket's administrative burden, cost and the risks associated with owning and operating a fiber network. However, the Town will build and own its Network.

Whip City Fiber will be a subcontractor to WiredWest and will operate and maintain our network and provide customer service to subscribers. It is owned and operated by Westfield Gas + Electric, which is providing broadband service to several other towns in Western Massachusetts.

Working with the Board of Selectmen, we expect several important decisions will be made shortly: the construction sequence, what the monthly service will cost and how much the Town will subsidize of the connection cost to residents who subscribe for service during the initial sign-up period.

# 4:30-6:30pm


Join local Registered Nurses David and Lisa Rosier for this free monthly clinic.
