
#### **THE SELECTMEN'S COLUMN**

As I write this column fall has arrived. The trees are turning some very brilliant colors. Enjoy the season before the white stuff flies.

The Board of Selectmen is being kept up to date by the Broadband Ad Hoc Group who are all volunteers and devote an immense amount of time to meetings. We cannot thank them enough for their dedication. The make-ready phase is in full swing and bids for the construction phase will be opened shortly. At the Annual Town Meeting (ATM) in 2016 money was appropriated to purchase the property at 21 Maple St. to be used as an expansion of the adjacent North Becket Village Park and to provide some additional parking for the school and park. At the ATM in 2017 money was appropriated to demolish the house and grade the property and install 6-8 parking spaces. This spring the Parks and Recreation Committee, joined by the Board of Selectmen, attended a hearing before the Conservation Committee. The Conservation Commission would not allow any parking on the parcel at this time citing conservation concerns close to the brook. The parcel has been graded, a fence installed with a pedestrian gate and hydro-seeded. Other parking options are being pursued.

On Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup> at noon, at the Town Hall, an auction will be conducted on 36 town owned parcels. Information is available on the town website <a href="www.townofbecket.org">www.townofbecket.org</a> and at the Town Hall. A current hot topic is the possibility of a turnpike exit on Algerie Rd. in Otis. MassDOT has promised to listen to all parties and their reasoning behind supporting or opposing this location for an exit. On Thursday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, MassDot will hold a public meeting at the Blandford Town Hall at 6 P.M. For the Board of Selectmen,

## 2 FREE After School Programs at the Athenaeum for Becket & Washington Students

#### **ACE TUTORING PROGRAM:**

- Grades 2-8 students
- Meets Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, through the school year to help students meet their academic goals.
- BWS students are met at the school by Athenaeum staff and walk back together. Middle school will be dropped off by the bus or their guardian by 3:15.
- Has paid staff, teen interns, and community volunteers working with 10-12 students. The aim is 1 to 2 students per tutor.
- Helps students with homework, studying for tests, and with their school projects, in addition to having supplemental educational and craft projects for when their individual work is complete for the day.
- The ACE and BWS staff work together to make sure students are getting the best team support possible as they work toward their academic goals.
- Starts Tuesday, September 10th, and there is space for a few more students.

If your child is in need of assistance with their school work, please return a completed application (available on our website and at the library).

#### FRIDAY ENRICHMENT PROGRAM:

Friday Enrichment (FE) is shifting focus for the 2019-20 school year as Sarah Reedy is unable to return to lead the program. We will break the year down to 3 segments: Fall, Winter, Spring.

Program description for the fall:

- Begins Friday, September 27th
- Grades 4-8
- Will focus on the geography and culture of one region/country for the fall.
- Will include music, crafts, regional foods & cooking, maps, and other activities that come from the selected region.
- We will transport to the Berkshire Outdoor Center once monthly in October and November for teambuilding and supplemental activities.
- There will be 1 field trip this fall, with one or two more later in the school year.
- FE does not meet on any Friday that precedes a Monday vacation day, nor on half-day school release.

2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Real Estate, District, and Personal Property Tax Bills are due by Friday November 1<sup>st</sup>. Set up a username and password using our on line bill pay system and schedule your payment now so it won't be late. There's no charge if you make the payment from your checking account. ## **Becket Broadband update**

The utility companies are continuing and forging ahead with the MakeReady phase of the project. Weather permitting, we hope the work will be completed by the end of the year. The Town is preparing to solicit bids for the construction phase of the project. We hope to select a contractor in November and commence construction as soon as the MakeReady phase is complete. The Broadband Ad Hoc Group will schedule an Informational Session during the winter to update homeowners on the project and answer any questions and concerns.
