The Town is waiting on electrical connection to the EV Charging stations recently installed at Town Hall. We are also working on a project to convert the current lighting at town owned buildings to LEDs. This will further reduce our electrical consumption.

August 24th was the annual Energy Committee Information Session with several speakers discussing topics ranging from solar to heat pumps, consumer programs, and electric vehicles. It was well attended and very informative.

Make Ready work for the Broadband Project is continuing with many utility poles being replaced around the Town. Please be cautious of crews working in your neighborhood.

Like regular library materials, electronic resources are checked out for a period of time and when they are due back, they simply leave your device and become available for the next interested patron. Also like other library materials, there are a limited number of digital copies of any given item at a time.

EV Charging Stations

The Town worked with Eversource to install two EV charging stations. We are waiting on Eversource to connect the power for them to be made available to the public. The stations are Chargepoint systems and will operate with a fee to be determined either by the amount of electricity used or a set fee based on time.
