# Town of Becket Board of Selectmen Meeting Minutes 7:00pm, September 16, 2020 Town Hall, 557 Main Street, Becket

#### 1. Call to order

BE called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

BE led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# 3. BOS to review and possibly vote on appointment application:

• Cathy Terwedow, Cultural Council, effective 9-16-2020 through 6-30-2023

Cathy Terwedow met with the BOS to introduce herself and discuss her interest in serving on the Cultural Council. Ms. Terwedow, a part-time resident for the past ten years, is now a full-time resident of Becket and she wishes to become involved in the community. She was encouraged by current members of the Cultural Council to submit an application to the BOS. CS moved to appoint Cathy Terwedow to the Cultural Council effective 9-16-2020 through 6-30-2023. ML 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote: unanimous. BE announced that Tracy Wilson submitted an application indicating that she wishes to rejoin the Cultural Council (due to family matters, a few years ago she needed to resign). ML moved to appoint Tracy Wilson to the Cultural Council effective 9-16-2020 through 6-30-2023. CS 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote: unanimous.

# 4. Broadband Update and BOS to discuss and possibly vote on policies and decisions relating to the Broadband Project

MLP Manager Bob Gross indicated that the drive-through to review remedial work required has been completed and he discussed handouts:

- 1. List of Remediation within Fiber Services Areas ("FSAs") (# of remediations needed, # of poles replaced). Bob also specified that the Town awaits information pertaining to the MBI 123 Cable remediation.
- 2. Remediation within FSAs 2, 1, 5, & 9. Bob reported on Broadband Ad Hoc Group's discussion with Westfield Gas & Electric. The BOS was amenable to the Broadband Ad Hoc Group's preliminary recommended sequence for build based on remediation and logistics of the design of the Town's Broadband system based on discussion with Westfield Gas & Electric. The preliminary recommendation is to prioritize FSAs 2, 1, 5 & 9. Bob stated that after the Town receives a commitment from the utilities about

- completing remediation (Make-Ready), a kick-off meeting will be scheduled with construction estimated to begin up to 30 days later.
- 3. Map of FSAs 2, 1, 5 & 9 (sketch with division of FSAs). Bob indicated that at this point, it is premature to announce the sequencing of the FSAs.

#### Other areas discussed:

- Underground Work: Family Court and Frederick Court have been completed. Bob received the majority of the paperwork for underground from Parsons Way. Parsons Way will be trenched by Raymaaker, a Westfield subcontractor. Raymaaker and Westfield will work together to finalize the design before work is started. William Holmes and Becket West have submitted most of their paperwork and they are opting for above ground with poles which will be done by Burke, a Westfield subcontractor. Burke and Westfield will work together to determine where and what is required for the poles.
- The Building & Grounds Technician is completing the construction of the hut. Westfield Gas & Electric's engineer ordered the technical supplies.
- Sertex builds network completely within the FSA. Once testing is completed, TriWire, a
  Westfield subcontractor, will start installing the drops. It is hoped that early next year,
  some premises will acquire service.
- The Broadband Ad Hoc Group anticipates discussion with the BOS on drop policy, payments, and budget.

#### 5. Discussion to promote the U.S. Census

Mark Sevastino spoke about the importance of the U.S. Census and discussed how the Town of Becket may increase its response rate. He indicated that in 2010, Becket had a 34.6% response rate. Currently Becket has a 39.9% response rate. Mark advised that response is needed not only for the primary residence but for all dwellings. Although the deadline may be extended, currently September 30th is the deadline to participate in the Census. Mark provided a Seasonal Home Flyer.

#### Actions to be taken:

- 1. BC will send the Seasonal Home Flyer via e-mail blast to the Town's MailChimp subscribers.
- 2. The BOS will ask some of the officials/contacts of the Lake/Road Districts and homeowner associations to distribute the Seasonal Home Flyers to its members.
- 3. CS will provide Mark with the contact info. for the Food Pantry. Mark will ask permission for a representative of the US Census to assist individuals with filling out the Census at the Food Pantry.

# 6. Approval of the September 2, 2020 Meeting Minutes

CS moved to approve the September 2, 2020 Meeting Minutes. ML 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote: unanimous.

# 7. BOS to discuss and possibly vote on the "Not In Our County" Pledge

BE inquired why Tommie Hutto-Blake suggested using the "Not In Our County Pledge" rather than the "Not In Our Town" Pledge. Tommie stated that the "Not In Our Town" Pledge was created in reaction to a tragic event whereas although the language of the "Not In Our County" Pledge is appropriate for an event, it is primarily designed to promote education, to serve as a proactive measure and as a reminder to support, look out for and stick up for one another. ML moved for the Select Board to sign the "Not In Our County"

pledge (wording listed below), and display the message as follows: 1. hang the pledge with the Select Board's signatures in the Town Hall 2. place a pledge sticker in the window of the front door of the Town Hall and 3. Place a lawn sign (not during winter) on the Town Hall property near Main Street. CS 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote: unanimous.

I commit to working together with my neighbors to create safer, more integrated communities for all residents in Berkshire County. I do not stay silent in the face of intolerance or hate based on race, religion. sexual orientation, gender identity, ethnicity, country of origin, ability or any other factor. I work to acknowledge and heal all forms of hate. bigotry and bullying. I pledge to renew my commitment to this work every day.

After the Select Board members signed and filled out their individual pledge cards, Tommie collected the informational portion of the cards to mail to the Multicultural BRIDGE organization in Lee, MA.

CS brought up that the Fire Department tested its recently acquired extraction tool located on Rescue 6 and it works great.

CS mentioned that he is pleased that the house on Benton Hill Road was demolished.

BC provided an update of several items that he been working on:

- Ambulance Garage will pour the concrete flooring tomorrow, grade/prep outside
- Town Hall HVAC nearly complete
- HL Fuel propane tanks to be installed on September 18
- Broadband Hut working on finishing construction
- Green Communities Competitive Grant awarded for heat pumps and insulation
- Police Dept. construction nearing completion
- Waiting on new septic numbers for Mullen House/Becket Arts Center/Athenaeum septic system bids
- TH reopening T/R 10am-2pm starting 10/6
- On 10-21-2020, the BOS will revisit whether they will allow the Council on Aging to meet in the Town Hall.
- DER grant award Ceremony

- Halloween discussed under agenda item 10.
- Excise tax ATM local option (Veterans) BC requested language from Town Counsel for an ATM Warrant Article
