Becket News

I think we are all hoping for Spring. We have seen some glimpses of it during this relatively mild winter.

The Board of Selectmen, Finance Committee and I are working on putting together a budget and Annual Town Meeting warrant that supports Town services. Becket currently ranks 323 of 351 for the lowest single family tax bills averaging \$2,600. A new expense is funding the new Wahconah Regional High School which will be on the warrant and the election ballot. We hope that voters approve this as a debt exclusion to maintain funding stability for future fiscal years.

The Broadband project continues to move forward. The Broadband Ad Hoc Group appreciates the responses to the survey and are using the data to help perform necessary tasks before constructions starts.

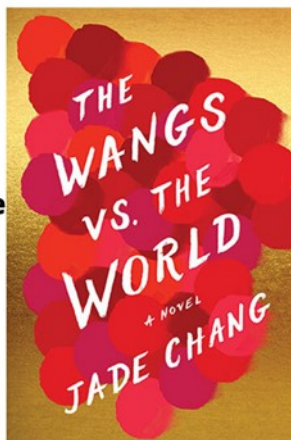

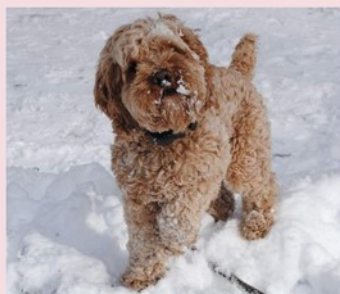

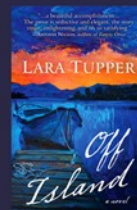
