1. Call to order

BE called the meeting to order at 7:03pm. He indicated that the SB was recording the meeting.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

BE led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Broadband Update and Select Board to discuss and possibly vote on policies and decisions relating to the Broadband Project

MLP Manager Bob Gross provided the following update:

Redundancy: The Broadband Ad Hoc Group is working to arrange to have a second pathway as a backup for the broadband network.

It is anticipated that FSA 9 will be released on November 1st with hookups to commence shortly after.

Based on recent progress, the Broadband Ad Hoc Group is cautiously optimistic that before the ground freezes, the underground drops will be done in all FSAs that have been released for connections so that those connections can occur in the wintertime.

The Town of Becket has started receiving monthly checks (MLP fees) from subscribers.

The Broadband Ad Hoc Group will schedule Information Sessions on Thursday, October 28th at 7pm, and Saturday morning on November 6th. The Broadband Ad Hoc Group will ask if the Energy Committee will join along in November. Based on state COVID-19 guidelines, they will determine whether in-person participation is possible or whether in-person attendance will be capped.

To date, with the exception of Police Detail costs, the budget is staying on course. Bob indicated that other towns are experiencing overages on their Police Detail expenses.

4. Approval of the September 22, 2021 Meeting Minutes

ML moved to approve the September 22, 2021 Select Board Meeting Minutes, CS 2nd. Motion carried 3-0.

- 6. Select Board to Vote to appoint members to the Open Space and Recreation Plan Committee effective 2021 through 12/31/2022: Cindy Delpapa; Larisa Shpitalnik, Meredyth Babcock, Al Blake, Michael Lavery

BC indicated that upcoming grants require an updated Open Space and Recreation Plan. BC added Ken Smith (Becket Land Trust) to the above captioned names who represent various town factions to serve on a committee charged with reviewing and updating the town's Open Space and Recreation Plan. CS moved to appoint Cindy Delpapa, Larisa Shpitalnik, Meredyth Babcock, Al Blake, Michael Lavery, and Ken Smith to the Open Space and Recreation Plan Committee effective October 6, 2021 through 12/31/2022. BE 2nd. Motion carried with ML recusing himself since he is included on the list.

Discussion ensued regarding odor, waste and water controls; typos, questions about property tax disposition for a legally separate marijuana entity in a CT municipality, interpretation of a legal opinion from the DOR, the addition of language relating to use of an olfactometer in the revised draft HCA presented at this meeting, questions and affirmation that the Planning Board may list conditions on its Special Permit, comments that this agreement may set a precedence, and annual payments.

ML moved to approve the Host Community Agreement between the Town of Becket and Tetrahydra Agtek LLC in conjunction with a Tier 11 Marijuana Cultivation Establishment solely for the cultivation, processing, packaging and transfer of marijuana for adult use, with approximately 2,000 square feet of administrative space, 90,000-100,000 square feet of cultivation space, 2,500 square feet of processing or manufacturing space, and 5,000 square feet of storage, administrative, and miscellaneous space, on a 5.6 acre lot at 0 Quarry Road, Becket, MA 01223 with the following change and corrections, with language to be vetted by Town Counsel. CS 2nd. Motion carried 3-0.

- 9. Town Administrator's Report

BC provided an update of several items that he has been working on:

 Town Hall, Highway, FS1 Fiber connected. Ambulance and Fire Station 1 needs to be connected.

- Received ARPA funds
 - o Funds to be used for Broadband
- Streetlights
 - Working with a contract to get Eversource incentive and purchase of ours. BC awaits reply from Eversource.
- MEMA/FEMA
 - o Berkshire/Franklin met threshold but the Commonwealth did not. MA and Becket will not receive MEMA/FEMA disaster assistance.
- Community Compact Grant
 - o Open Space and Recreation Plan (BRPC)
- MVP Master Plan w/Climate resilience focus next year
- META Grant- Later GC competitive Grant
 - o Wind Turbine apply for green communities
- Procurement Class
 - o Completed will apply for MCPPO certification
- HCAs
 - o Black Cat Withdrew the HCA
 - o Tetra Hydra tonight (discussed above)
- Massworks
 - o McNerney Rd BC anticipates we will receive state funding for work to occur next summer.
- Leonhardt Rd. repair- Monday work will commence.

BC discussed repair to the Town Hall roof. The Building and Grounds Technician had advised that water is leaking into the Town Hall from the cupola. Portions of the cupola have rotted. The SB agreed that repair will involve removing the cupola so that the roof may be sealed. The cupola which originated from a former town school building will be stored and evaluated for the town's re-use.

BC advised that Jenn Beatty, Executive Director of the Becket Arts Center, had requested a meeting with him and the Chair of the Finance Committee. Adele Levine, Becket Arts Center Trustee, explained that the purpose of the meeting is to provide an update about the BAC's prior year and future plans for the upcoming year.

10. Select Board's Comments and Announcements

ML initiated discussion regarding the movement within the United States and in the Commonwealth to recognize Indigenous Peoples Day in place of the Columbus Day Holiday. ML moved to replace Columbus Day with the name Indigenous Peoples Day, CS 2nd. Motion carried with BE opposed.

CS reported that he arranged for locally sourced Hemlock timber donations [Bill Robinson (Robinson Farm), Barbara Goodwin (Goodwin Road), and John Lowell (Brooker Hill Road)] and he acquired logs from other areas of Becket to form the frame of the church bell tower at the First Congregational Church of Becket

11. Any other business to come before the Board

The SB agreed that the Town may resume Halloween Trick or Treating (October 31st, 5pm till 7pm). Due to COVID-19, 2020 Trick or Treating was cancelled.

BG advised the Fire Chief mentioned the Volunteer Fire Dept. will hold a drive-through Halloween event on Oct. 31st (time tba) and the Town of Washington will not hold its pumpkin walk this year.
