## SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES 7:00pm, December 1, 2021 Town Hall, 557 Main Street, Becket

#### 1. Call to order

BE called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. He indicated that the SB was recording the meeting.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

BE led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### 3. Approval of the November 17, 2021 Meeting Minutes

ML moved to approve the November 3, 2021 Select Board Meeting Minutes, BE 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried 3-0.

4. Public Input (limited to 3 minutes per person, 20 minutes total for this agenda item).

None. Under Agenda Item 7, BC read/discussed the MLP Manager's Broadband update.

#### 5. Board to consider Renewals of Annual Licenses:

- <u>Dreamaway Inc. (d/b/a Dream Away Lodge)</u>: All Alcoholic Beverages Restaurant, Common Victuallers, Six Day Entertainment, and Sunday Entertainment
- M.D.A. Inc. (d/b/a Berkshire Berries): All Alcoholic Beverages Restaurant, Wine & Malt Package Store, and a Common Victuallers;
- Mountain Grove Association Inc.: All Alcoholic Beverages Club, Common Victuallers, Six-Day Entertainment, and Automatic Amusement
- Sherwood Shoppe of Becket LLC: All Alcoholic Beverages Package Store, and Common Victuallers;
- Papa Bob's LLC: All Alcoholic Beverages Restaurant, Common Victuallers, Six Day Entertainment, Sunday Entertainment, and Automatic Amusement;
- Becket General Store Inc. (d/b/a Becket General Store): All Alcoholic Beverages Package Store, All Alcoholic Beverages Restaurant, Six Day Entertainment, Sunday Entertainment, and Common Victuallers
- Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival: Six Day Entertainment, Sunday Entertainment
  BE stated that although Dream Away is currently not operating, the owner Daniel Osman
  wishes to renew his licenses and transfer them when the sale of his property occurs
  (anticipated early 2022). BC awaits Town Counsel's opinion as to whether Dream Away
  must have insurance when it is not operating. BE reported the Building Inspector conveyed
  all premises passed Building/Fire Inspector Inspections and he will provide inspection
  certificates. BG reported Heather Anello indicated Becket General Store's Workers Comp
  is renewed in December and she will forward certificates to the Select Board: Ms. Anello
  will need to sign the WC affidavit form.

BE stated that all required documents and payments must be received prior to release of licenses.

CS moved to approve the above captioned licenses for operation during 2022, and this stipulates that Dream Away will comply with Town Counsel's opinion relating to insurance, ML 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote: 3-0.

## 7. Town Administrator's Report

BC provided an update of several items that he has been working on:

- Community Compact Grant: Open Space and Recreation Plan (BRPC), Agreement with BRPC
- MVP Master Plan w/Climate resilience focus next year: Spring
- META Grant- Later GC competitive Grant in spring: We were not awarded
- Massworks: McNerney Rd
- Leonhardt Road: STM will be needed. Begin to look at dates after the holidays; Will check with PB for any other articles; The SB favored BC's idea to change the Bylaw to sending a postcard rather than mailing the entire warrant. BC will research the language to add this to the STM warrant.
- USDA Grant Covid health funds; Can be used for squad vehicle and ambulance monitor; Receiving quotes; 75/25 split
- USDA Grant Cruiser: More information in the spring
- AFG Grant: Attempt to fund engine
- Becket Police Dept./Otis Police Dept.: Shared service BC met with the Otis Town Administrator. They will draft an inter-municipal agreement for Town Counsel's review and then present it to the Select Boards. BC will ask Town Counsel about changing the Police Chief's position from an annual appointment to a 3 year contract. BE suggested this may be something to try on a trial-basis.
- BE initiated discussion on the status of air conditioning for the Town Hall. BC advised the condensers are stored in the Town Hall and in the spring, he will arrange for the plumber to connect them to the Town's system.

BC read the MLP Manager's update on the Broadband Project:

- The ability to do underground work will end shortly. WCF will give priority to jobs which require plowing.
- FSA09 should be completed by Sertex the end of the week. WCF will then need up to two weeks to test the network before drops can start.
- As mentioned before, aerial drops will continue throughout the winter, weather permitting.
- Premises in the active FSA's with underground service which could not be done may have the
  opportunity to have a temporary connection. As long as they can run a drop fiber on the ground
  and not cross a driveway or walking path, it can be done. The cost to the homeowner will be
  \$150 and not covered by the subsidy.
- After underground work has completely stopped, we will contact those premises that could not be done and advise them that they may be able to get a temporary installation. WCF will evaluate those premises which are interested to see if the work can be done if possible.
- MakeReady work is still an issue. WCF and the State seem to be making progress. At the
  present time, there is a single pole on Jacobs Ladder Road that is a show stopper. Hopefully
  Bill Ennen will successfully get the problem resolved.
- Sherwood Forest (with Road District approval) will be getting three utility poles to span an area on Sir George Drive without electric or telephone service which is part of the network design.

In addition, several areas need tree trimming that is not the responsibility of Eversource. Fortunately, I have confirmed that the State will reimburse us for the expense as it is considered MakeReady.

#### 8. Select Board's Comments and Announcements

CS moved to reimburse ML \$254.32, from the Select Board's expense account, for purchase of two signs for the Esau's Heel Trail. BE 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion carried with ML recusing himself.

### Any other business to come before the Board

BG reported Al Blake of the Energy Committee informed her that Katherine Hoak and Susan Purser swapped positions on the Energy Committee. CS moved to appoint Susan Purser full member of the Energy Committee with an expiration date of 2024 and Katherine Hoak Alternate member of the Energy Committee with an expiration date of 2022. ML 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 3-0.
