# SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES 7:00pm, February 2, 2022 Town Hall, 557 Main Street, Becket

#### 1. Call to order

BE called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. He indicated that the SB was recording the meeting.

# 2. Pledge of Allegiance

BE led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# 3. Broadband Update and Select Board to discuss and possibly vote on policies and decisions relating to the Broadband Project

MLP Manager Bob Gross provided the following update:

- Today Fiber Service Area 4 was turned over to Whip City Fiber for the two-week testing. Connections will follow.
- 589 premises are activated. 1,169 people have expressed interest. We are almost at a 50 percent take-rate and anticipate that we will exceed a 60 percent take rate.
- Issues with Becket Woods (BW):
  - 1) Problem in the first two phases of construction. A mockup as to how the work should be done was shown to Burke. This information was not conveyed to Burke's foreman, but Westfield Gas + Electric signed-off on the work. There is an issue as to who will pay for the remediation. Bob conveyed to BW that this is an issue between them and Westfield Gas + Electric, and Burke. The Broadband Ad Hoc Group counseled them not to alienate Burke because Burke can decide not to do phase 3. Bob described and fielded questions about the problems which relate to composite vaults. Fiber is placed into the vaults and there are core drills for a micro-ducts. Burke placed the micro-ducts under the vault and they noticed one micro-duct placed at Fred Snow/Woodmere was crimped. Even if the micro-ducts are not currently crimped, due to anticipated ground settling, this must be corrected to protect the fiber. This cannot be addressed during wintertime when they cannot access the boxes.
  - 2) It was Whip City Fiber's understanding that they would do a cursory project management for BW at no cost. However, more extensive "hand-holding" is needed and Whip City Fiber has advised that they will charge for such. Bob advised to BW that the town will not pay for project management as that is BW's responsibility. He explained that in other underground areas, they all paid for their own project management. The project management cost for the other areas was not a distinct cost but incorporated into the contractual arrangements with Whip City Fiber's contractor, Raymaakers.

Bob left the meeting at 7:13pm.

- MassWorks anticipates receiving the price for design and surveying work for
  McNerney Rd. He will apply for Complete Streets for widening and creating a mix-used path.
  BC believes the widening will occur on the righthand side at the top of the hill. The survey
  will provide details about the proposed width (BC believes it is approx. 5-8 feet wide) and
  locations.

to serve. If no one from the Parks & Recreation Committee or Conservation Commission is available, they want to post this opening for other Becket residents. ML moved to add a seventh member to the Open Space & Recreation Committee with a term ending June 30, 2022, and the Open Space & Recreation Committee may first search for its seventh member from the Parks & Recreation Committee or Conservation Commission before other residents may apply for this position. CS 2<sup>nd</sup>: Motion carried with ML recusing himself.
