SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES 7:00pm, June 15, 2022 Town Hall, 557 Main Street, Becket

- 1. The Chairperson will call the Select Board meeting to order.

 At 7:00pm, BE called the meeting to order and indicated that the SB was recording the meeting.
- 2. **Pledge of Allegiance**BE led the Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. 7:05pm, Public Hearing on the application of Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival Inc. for a new Seasonal All Alcoholic Beverage Restaurant License for premises located at 358 George Carter Road, Becket, MA, 01223

At 7:05pm, BE read the public hearing notice for the above captioned and opened the public hearing. BG advised that Jacob's Pillow application to the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission for the Seasonal All Alcoholic Beverage Restaurant License for premises located at 358 George Carter Road, Becket contained all required documents. She handed the application to the SB for review. A.J. explained that to assume additional control and have better accountability, Jacobs Pillow Dance Festival Inc. will return to holding their own licenses and discontinue using outside vendors to procure their licenses. He indicated that the food/beverages operations will continue in the center campus locations. The SB specified the proposed hours of operation: Wed-Thurs 4:00pm - 10:00pm; Fri 4:00pm - 11:00pm; Sat 11:00am - 11:00pm; Sun 11:00am - 4:00pm. No others commented. ML moved to approve Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival Inc.'s application for a seasonal All Alcoholic Beverage Restaurant for premises located at 358 George Carter Road, Becket, MA 01223. BE 2nd: Motion carried. The SB will submit the application to the ABCC. At 7:09pm, the hearing concluded.

- 4. Broadband Update and Select Board to discuss and possibly vote on policies and decisions relating to the Broadband Project

- 5. Approval of the 6/1/2022 Meeting Minutes

 ML moved to approve the 6/1/2022 meeting minutes, BE 2nd: Motion carried.
- 6. Public Input (limited to 3 minutes per person, 20 minutes total for this agenda item).

7. Ed Pickert, Highway Superintendent, to discuss use of Pothole funding and discussion and request to increase the Transfer Station Household Trash Fee Schedule due to increased disposal costs of spring and foam items

Ed Pickert, Highway Superintendent, suggested using \$146,000 pothole funding for oil and stonework on Quarry Road (From the Quarry to Route 20) and Upper County Road (portion from the intersection of Stanley to past the Dream Away Lodge). Prep work involves patching. He estimates this surfacing will last approximately four to five years.

Other road-related discussion: 1) Ed Picker will arrange for line painting on Quarry Road which will be added the list of streets regularly painted. 2) Ed Pickert mentioned the Highway Dept. will swap snowplow blades depending on road surface (segmented blades damage oil and stone surfaces); 3) BE mentioned that replacement of the Quarry Road Bridge (over Cushman Brook) near Route 20 is on the 2026 Berkshire Region Transportation Improvement Project list; 3) other roads that may benefit from oil and stone (upper section of Benton Hill Road) 4) To file insurance claims, in the next few weeks, Ed Pickert anticipates obtaining quotes for repair of two guardrails sections (hit & run damage) located on Yokum Pond Road

<u>Transfer Station discussion – Bulky Waste</u>

Ed Pickert reported that Valley Rolloff sent notification that due to an increase in their disposal fees for foam and spring upholstered items, they will charge the town \$50.00 per piece across the board for disposal of mattresses, couches, recliners, love seats, chairs will rise effectively immediately. Per Mr. Picker's recommendation, <u>CS moved to increase the Transfer Station bulky waste per piece fee for mattresses and upholstered items to \$50.00, effective 7/2/2022, ML 2nd: Motion carried unanimously.</u>

The SB agreed the Transfer Station should continue not charging for disposal of fluorescent light bulbs to prevent these items from being discarded in the regular trash. Mr. Pickert estimates the annual cost will be \$400.00 or \$500.00 if Valley Rolloff determines it is necessary to charge the town a per bulb fee.

 - Charlene Auger promotion from Part-Time Reserve Police Officer to Full-time Officer effective July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 (corrected from June 30, 2022 listed on the agenda)

Police Chief McDonough spoke in support of promoting Charlene Auger to full-time status. He indicated that she has worked for the town since 2017, does an excellent job, is a great fit with the department and recently completed the Bridge Academy. The Police Department's FY2023 budget, approved at Town Meeting, will cover this full-time position. Police Chief McDonough brought up that changing to full-time status is sensible when considering police reform legislation (which requires reserve officers to have the same level of training and certification as for full-time officers and is more onerous for smaller police departments). ML moved to approve the Town Administrator's recommendation for an appointment that will promote Charlene Auger to Full-time Police Officer effective July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, CS 2nd: Motion carried unanimously.

11. Select Board to vote on renewal of the agreement between the Town of Becket and the Town of Otis for Shared Police Chief Services effective 7/1/2022 through 6/30/2023.

MW updated the dates and dollar amounts on the existing agreement between the Town of Becket

and the town of Otis for shared Police chief Services. Police Chief McDonough stated that this arrangement has been going very well, he has been enjoying working for both towns, and he is up for continuing the additional work and challenge.

CS moved to approve renewal of the shared services agreement between the Town of Becket and the Town of Otis for Shared Police Services effective 7/1/2022 through 6/30/2023. ML 2nd: Motion carried unanimously. MW indicated that <u>The Beacon</u> publication interviewed Police Chief McDonough. At 7:29pm, Police Chief McDonough left the meeting.

13. Town Administrator's Report

After MW met with the Fire Chief and Fire Department Officers last week, he posted/advertised the bid for one (1) 2022 OR NEWER FIRE APPARATUS, FIRE PUMPER. Bid documents may also be found on the town website. The bid opening is scheduled for 7pm at the 7/6/2022 Select Board's meeting. The town awaits a response to the bid application for this vehicle.

Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival gave the town a \$7,500.00 Payment in Lieu of Taxes.

A contractor is tentatively scheduled to appear at Town Hall next week to retrofit the air conditioning system and hookup the gas line to the generator (generator will also be tested) at Town Hall.

Tomorrow the Highway Superintendent and MW will interview an applicant for the Town Mechanic position.

Town Counsel advised to MW that an appeal against the Planning Board Special Permit for the Quarry Road marijuana facility filed with Land Court does not require SB action/response at this time.

14. Select Board's Comments and Announcements

Michael: Grand Opening Ceremony for the Newly Created Esau's Heel Trail will occur at 10:00am on Saturday, June 18th. The public is welcome to attend and this will be announced through the website news/e-mail blast.

BE reported that in response to the Historical Commission and Parks & Recreation Committee's invitation, he attended yesterday's opening ceremony of the North Becket Park dedication of the special seating area/plaque in remembrance of the historical Baptist Parsonage Building (21 Maple Street). BE represented the SB and gave a speech to the school children at this event. BE reported on enhancements (electricity, porta potty, signs, walking path has been re-done) and encourages the community to visit.

15. Any other business to come before the Board

The Select Board approved the Becket Scholarship Foundation and Broadband Ad Hoc Group Tax Inserts.

BG advised that the following individuals did not wish to be reappointed: Tina Lavasseur (Parks & Recreation Committee), Sally Baumer (Cultural Council), and Steve Rosenthal (Harbor Master). Mr. Rosenthal had conveyed his willingness to continue serving as the Harbor Master until another individual is appointed and he will help transition this position: The SB agreed for MW to inquire with a person who had previously expressed interest. BG will send the Country

Journal a list of open Committee/Board positions, and she will post them on the town website.
