Pursuant to the foregoing warrant, the Annual Town Meeting was called on May 13, 2017, 7:00 p.m. at Becket Washington School, 12 Maple Street, Becket, MA 01223. There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by the Moderator. There were 100 registered voters present (7.18% of 1,392 registered voters) and a total of 120 people attended the meeting. Town Officials Present: Bruce Garlow, Moderator; Ethan Klepetar, Deputy Moderator, Jeanne Pryor, Bill Elovirta, and Nicole Ledoux, Selectmen; Ann Spadafora, Maria Wallington, Dan Parnell, Ronald Defoe, and Mark Karlberg; Finance Committee Members; George E. Roberts, Town Clerk; Edward Gibson, Town Administrator; Joel Bard, Esq., Town Counsel.

The Moderator opened the meeting stating the rules to be followed. He welcomed all non-voters and noted that while they could address the meeting, they could not vote. The Moderator noted measures he would take to speed up the meeting, including paraphrasing each article (as the articles are available in written form). The Moderator reviewed the warrant and declared it to have been duly posted as evidenced by the attestation of the posting constable.

William Elovirta offered a brief statement in remembrance of Police Officer Michael Sawyer, who passed unexpectedly on Thursday, May 4th, 2017 after suffering a massive heart attack. The meeting then observed a moment of silence for Michael Sawyer. Jeanne Pryor spoke on behalf of the Board of Selectmen honoring Bruce Garlow for his 21 years of service as Town Moderator. Dan Parnell gave a brief statement regarding the challenges in this year's budget. Bruce Garlow, as his swan-song, recited his poem "Town Meeting Farewell" celebrating the Town Meeting form of government and passing his gavel to his Deputy Moderator.

Town Meeting Farewell

Our tradition of town meeting is healthy and alive Becket's first was held here in 1765 The state was just a colony, this was just a colonial town Under the thumb of a governor appointed by the Crown.

But we ran our local government mostly on our own Free from interference from the governor or the throne Free men debating and deciding the issues of the day Too bad it took so long to let the ladies have their say

It's a legislative body, like in Boston or D.C. But we finish up in just one night, that's our history Budgets, bylaws and taxes, the topics they dealt with back then Are revisited year after year and over again.

But all of it's important, it's how we govern our town The purest form of democracy anywhere around Everyone's a legislator, equal in every way Except your kindly moderator who stands above the fray.

After twenty years at the podium, it's time to step aside. I do so with humility and a bunch of Becket pride
It's been my honor and privilege to serve every one of you
But after I'm done here tonight my town meeting time is through.

I'll pass this battered gavel to a smarter, younger man If anyone can do this job I think that Ethan can. He'll serve in a position that's two hundred and fifty years strong I know his service will be distinguished, superior and long.

The proposed change intended to reduce ambiguity in the application of driveway regulations throughout the community given the many different state, town, and district agencies and associations involved in the permitting process.

Formative changes that are codified and contextual are as follows:

Driveways: Driveway access to public and private ways is permitted by right with concurrence of the State's, Town's or District's Highway/Superintendent and in case where this is not possible applicants may apply for a Special Permit from the Planning Board.

Access/Location/Site Distances: All driveways shall be constructed in a manner ensuring reasonable and safe access from the road servicing to within or less than one hundred (100) feet from the building or residential structure. Driveways shall maintain clear site line distance especially at intersections for the safety of vehicles and pedestrians and shall not be located within eighteen (18) feet of a sideline.

Road-Line Angle/Grade/Distance: The intersection with the road line shall not be less than 90 degrees for a distance of twenty (20) feet into the lot and the grade shall not exceed three (3%) in this area.

Width/Surface/Drainage: Driveways shall have minimum cleared width of (twelve) 12 feet at the entrance to the road for the first twenty (20) feet, be construct of approved graded material. Water from the driveway shall not drain on the road or abutter property.

Environmental/Maintenance/Numbering: Any adjacent disturbed areas during construction of a driveway shall be stabilized and planted with ground cover prior to completion. Residential address numbers shall be clearly displayed at the intersection of the driveway entrance with the road. Maintenance of the driveway curb cut shall be maintained to the satisfaction of the approving authority.
