

MINUTES

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Pursuant to the foregoing warrant, a Special Town Meeting was called on July 26, 2010, 7:00 p.m. at Becket Town Hall, 557 Main Street, Becket. There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 7:14 p.m. by the Moderator. There were 20 voters present and a total of 22 people attended the meeting. Town Officials Present: Bruce Garlow, Moderator; William Cavanaugh, George Fuller, Selectmen; Jeremy Dunn, and Ann Spadafora, Finance Committee Members; George Roberts, Town Clerk; Tony Blair, Town Administrator. The Moderator opened the meeting stating the rules to be followed. He asked for a show of hands of non-voters noting that they were welcome to address the meeting but that they may not vote. Moderator, read the call of the meeting and officer's return of service and the Moderator noted the warrant as having been duly posted. The Moderator declared a Legal Town Meeting. The following articles were voted on:

Article 1: To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money - Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$17,000) from the Ambulance Department Receipts Reserved Account to the Ambulance Salary Account for the balance of the 2010 fiscal year.

Article 1 was moved by Ann Spadafora and seconded by Jeremy Dunn. There was no discussion. **Article 1 passed unanimously.**

Article 2: To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money - Five Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$5,100) from the Stabilization Account to the Ambulance Salary Account for the balance of the 2010 fiscal year.

Article 2 was moved by Ann Spadafora and seconded by Jeremy Dunn. There was no discussion. **Article 2 passed unanimously.**
